MINUTES SUMNER COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MARCH 20, 2017

The Board of County Commissioners of Sumner County, Tennessee met in regular session on Monday, March 20, 2017, in the Commission Chambers of the Sumner County Administration Building in Gallatin, Tennessee at 7:00 p.m. Present and presiding was the Chairman Scott Langford. Having a duly constituted quorum, the meeting was opened in due process by Sheriff Sonny Weatherford. There was no report.

HIGHWAY COMMISSION

Commissioner Graves stated that the Highway Commission met and considered the approval of three new roads. He said the Highway Department has equipment needs for the future.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Commissioner Decker reported that the Education Committee approved multiple school renovation projects reported under the Budget Committee. Distributed to commissioners was a "Sumner County School Construction Update" dated March 1, 2017. Commissioner Decker stated that the original estimate of \$69 million to complete these projects will be short by two percent or more. He said in the next few months the Commission will need to consider a possible bond issuance to compete these and other projects.

Commissioner Decker stated that William and Martha Brown left an estimated \$8 million to Sumner County schools, of which \$500,000.00 was set aside for a park on the new school property. The remaining \$7.5 million will go into an endowment to promote educational technology. The trustees will be the Director of Schools and the County Executive.

Chairman Langford recognized Director of Finance David Lawing who stated with the existing stream of debt service and property tax revenues, current debt capacity was about \$60 million.

GENERAL OPERATIONS COMMITTEE

There was no report from General Operations Committee.

EMERGENCY SERVICES COMMITTEE

Commissioner Vaughn stated that there were several resolutions passed by the Emergency Services Committee reported under the Budget Committee. He further reported that the EMS department will exceed its budget for payroll and require additional funds at some point.

WHEREAS, the Sumner County Board of County Commissioners provide funding for local emergency medical services; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee General Assembly in the 2017 legislative session will entertain legislation that would create a Ground Ambulance Assessment Revenue Fund to be used to improve Medicaid reimbursement to Tennessee EMS systems and thereby help offset the increasing cost of prehospital ground ambulance service; and

WHEREAS, reimbursement for ground ambulance transportation through TennCare (Medicaid) does not recognize the actual cost incurred by ground ambulance providers for the provision of emergency medical services – typically 60% - 80% of the actual cost to ground ambulance providers; and

WHEREAS, municipalities and counties are required to use alternative funding sources to supplant the costs incurred for the provision of EMS services to Medicaid recipients; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated § 68-140-301 – Emergency Medical Services Act of 1983 established the Division of EMS under the Tennessee Department of Health, and empowers counties the ability to provide vital life-saving emergency medical services to its citizens and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the increasing demand for services of EMS systems throughout Tennessee along with the cost associated with providing adequate and timely emergency medical services continues to grow; and

WHEREAS, the profession of Emergency Medical Technicians is everchanging when considering skill, training and knowledge, and the cost to employ and retain such personnel and to provide and maintain life-saving tools for these professionals continues to rise at an alarming rate and has therefore placed severe funding burdens on counties throughout Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, this legislation would provide a much-needed offsetting revenue source without creating a fiscal burden upon the State of Tennessee by

providing the necessary state funds in order to receive federal matching funds through the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services; and

WHEREAS, the goal of this legislation is to close the gap of the ground ambulance transport costs and the current reimbursement for services from TennCare.

- (f.) pollutants which may enter Old Hickory Lake.
