MINUTES SUMNER COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FEBRUARY 25, 2019

The Board of County Commissioners of Sumner County, Tennessee met in regular session on Monday, February 25, 2019, in the Commission Chambers of the Sumner County Administration Building in Gallatin, Tennessee at 7:00 p.m. Present and presiding was the Chairman Scott Langford. Having a duly constituted quorum, the meeting was opened in due process by Sheriff Sonny Weatherford. Chairman Scott Langford noted that with twenty-four members seated, a simple majority would be by thirteen votes; and that matters requiring a two-thirds vote would be by sixteen votes during this session. County Executive Anthony Holt was not present due to the passing of his father.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by the County Clerk, Bill Kemp.

Commissioner Echols moved, and was duly seconded by Commissioner Mansfield, to adopt the agenda. The Commission approved the agenda by unanimous voice vote of the body.

He further stated that increased funds to the volunteer fire departments would be needed to cover their cost of maintenance.

Commissioner Taylor requested the minutes to show that his intent of making the second was that the increased expense born by each department for the yearly maintenance cost would be absorbed by individual existing budgets, not added as an increase to the budgets.

Chairman Langford recognized County Law Director Leah Dennen who stated that the cost sharing could be among County departments, but there are other entities that have to be made aware of these additional terms and agree to them.
