The Board of County Commissioners of Sumner County, Tennessee met in regular session on Monday, July 15, 2019, in the Commission Chambers of the Sumner County Administration Building in Gallatin, Tennessee at 7:00 p.m. Present and presiding was the Chairman Scott Langford. RECOGNITION OF THE PUBLIC

Chairman Langford opened the floor to allow the public to speak concerning any matter on the agenda.

David Deere of 805 East Main Street in Gallatin spoke on the 2019-2020 budget and revenue generation for the County. He requested that the County consider adjusting its spending and tax structure to account for the cyclical housing market. He said the County needs to implement new property development fees.

Kevin Baigert of 424 A B Wade Road in Portland spoke on 1907-03 regarding email policies. He wished the language was stronger to require use of the new emails.

Kim Rice of 126 N Browns Lane in Portland spoke on the non-profit budget resolution. She said her non-profit group supports the volunteer fire departments and asked for financial support from the County.

Jack Chappell of 1758 Long Hollow Pike commended the Commission for taking the budget off the agenda. He said that construction and development costs are on the backs of taxpayers through higher taxes. He supported the new property development fees. In regard to the Liberty Creek School sewer, he said turning over the sewer line to the White House Utility District should not happen.

Brad Plumlee of 685 Bugg Hollow Road commended the Commission for deferring the budget in order to get to the truth. He asked for honesty in the process.

Ruth Fennell of 1049 Blue Jay Way in Gallatin asked the commissioners who do they serve. She thanked the Commission for delaying budget approval and expressed concern about the effects of a tax increase.

Laura Baigert of 424 A B Wade Road in Portland thanked the Commission for the delaying the budget. She asked the Commission to restore the cuts to the volunteer fire department.

With no one else wishing to speak, recognition of the public was closed.

Chairman Langford directed the Clerk to read the following notice into the record:

MINUTE BOOK TWENTY-TWO JULY 15, 2019

Chairman Langford read the following email into the record:

TO: MEMBERS OF THE SUMNER COUNTY COMMISSION

FROM: LEAH MAY DENNEN

DATE: JUNE 28, 2019

RE: SEWER LINE PLACEMENT

SUMMARY: Our Courts have long held that the County Commission has neither constitutional nor statutory authority relative to the erection, furnishing and equipping of school buildings or the services to those facilities. Therefore, with the removal of the county greenway project, the Commission can make no decisions about the type, placement or timeline of the utilities to the school site.

On Monday evening, after the passage of the resolution which provided for the removal of the greenway component of the Liberty Creek project, Commissioner Hinton asked to refer the sewer issues back to General Operations Committee. On Tuesday, he telephoned me and started a dialogue about what the responsibilities of the Commission were as it related to the utilities and school details, now that the County no longer had any part of the project. He also reminded me of past discussions about how money is given and how, once promised, strings cannot be added. This put me on a research trail that prompted me to dig into the long history of duties of schools and commissions. From this research, I have come to several conclusions which must be immediately provided to you.

ANALYSIS: The general-purpose bond issue passed by this body allows for the expenditure of up to three million dollars in bond funds for the placement of off-site water, sewer and road improvements to the new Liberty Creek school. The bonds were sold and placed with the Trustee in early 2019.

When this body passed the bonds, no restrictions were placed on the funds other than for use on utilities and road improvements to the new school site. Therefore, with the removal of the county greenway portion of the project, the School System is the body to plan and proceed with the school construction. The Board of Education hired engineers and other professionals to determine the proper type, location, size, etc. of the necessary utilities. Plans were completed in the manner the utility district deemed appropriate. The Board of Education, with that three-million-dollar budget in mind, undertook the most cost-effective route to get services to the school site.

The courts of Tennessee have long held that it is the responsibility of the local Board of Education to plan, locate, erect and furnish public schools in the County and that the County Commission is without authority to direct the specifics of school construction. The Tennessee Supreme Court has observed for decades that the

County Commission has neither constitutional nor statutory authority relative to the erection, furnishing and equipping of school buildings.

Under Tennessee statutes, a local board of education has the authority and responsibility to determine the need for and to construct schools, including site location, design and all phases of construction. The pipe size and route of services, along with where a school is to be placed or what color it is to be, is determined by the Board of Education. The County Commission does not have authority over school construction contracts. The Commission only has the authority to tax, to appropriate funds for school construction, and to audit the use of the funds.

Additionally, after the county legislative body issues bonds and deposits the proceeds with the county trustee, it has no control over the way the money is spent, the selection of the sites, and the erection of the school buildings. Once the county commission has passed a resolution authorizing the issuance of the bonds for the purpose of construction and renovation of the schools, it is clear that the board of education has the exclusive authority to draw upon these funds and to allocate the proceeds for the purposes the bonds were sold.

When the access to the new Liberty Creek complex included a county component (the greenway), the County arguably retained some control over that portion of the project. However, now that the greenway project has been removed, the Board is in charge of the project, with its limitations being the bond fund maximum.

Commissioners Moe Taylor and Mansfield objected to the ruling of the law director.
