MINUTES SUMNER COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MAY 18, 2020

The Board of County Commissioners of Sumner County, Tennessee met in regular session on Monday, May 18, 2020, in the Commission Chambers of the Sumner County Administration Building in Gallatin, Tennessee at 7:00 p.m. Present and presiding was the Chairman Scott Langford. Also present were the County Clerk Bill Kemp, County Mayor Anthony Holt and County Law Director Leah Dennen and the following Commissioners to wit:

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Chairman Langford declared the motion to remove an item from the agenda did not pass by the necessary two-thirds vote.

Commissioner Mansfield stood for a point of personal privilege to request information regarding the late night construction work going on at the new Liberty Creek campus. Chairman Langford stated that he would try to find the answer.

Commissioner Goode stood for a point of personal privilege to ask that the minutes reflect that the law director directed the Commission against approving the request to forgo ambulance transport charges during the March Coronavirus outbreak at a Gallatin nursing home.

Commissioner Foster moved, and was duly seconded by Commissioner Ring, to adopt the agenda with the additions. The Commission approved the agenda as amended by voice vote of the body. Commissioners Moe Taylor and Mansfield voted no.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes for the meeting of this body held on April 20, 2020 and recorded in the office of the Clerk, Bill Kemp, were approved by voice vote after Commissioner

Moe Taylor made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Rhodes. Commissioner Krueger requested her voted be changed from not voting to yes on Page 300 regarding Resolution 2004-04 and 2004-05. Without objection, Chairman Langford approved the change.

RECOGNITION OF THE PUBLIC

Chairman Langford opened the floor to allow the public to speak concerning any matter on the agenda.

Dave Dozier of 567 Dobbins Pike in Gallatin, whose land borders the Development, stated his opposition to the interlocal agreement and the proposed "Meadows" development.

Tonya Dozier of 567 Dobbins Pike in Gallatin stated her opposition to the proposed development and to approval of 2005-01.

Brad Wear of 750 Wallace Road in Gallatin spoke against the interlocal agreement stating that it would forever change the character of Sumner County and asked for an overall county growth plan and economic impact statement.

Andy Leath of 114B West Main Street in Gallatin, representative of the annexation project, addressed the aspects of the proposed annexation, including the railroad bridge and traffic.

Frosty Gregory of 201 Wallace Road in Gallatin stated that he has a farm that borders the property in question and said that this is a good use of the property.

Robert Ream of 463 Dobbins Pike in Gallatin was in favor of the proposed annexation and development.

Joe Wallace of 445 Wallace Road in Gallatin asked the Commission to approve the proposed annexation.

Kevin Baigert of 424 A B Wade Road in Portland thanked the Budget Committee and others and for the Covid-19 response but questioned the social distancing efforts at the County level.

With no one else wishing to speak, recognition of the public was closed.
