MINUTES SUMNER COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MAY 15, 2023

The Board of County Commissioners of Sumner County, Tennessee met in regular session on Monday, May 15, 2023, in the Commission Chambers of the Sumner County Administration Building in Gallatin, Tennessee at 7:00 p.m. Present and presiding was the Chairman Merrol N. Hyde. Also present were the County Clerk Carolyn Templeton, County Mayor John C. Isbell, Law Director Eric Sitler and Staff Attorney Steve Weiner, and the following Commissioners to wit:

Having a duly constituted quorum, the meeting was opened in due process by Sheriff Chief Deputy Eric Craddock. RECOGNITION OF THE PUBLIC

Chairman Hyde opened the floor to allow the public to speak concerning any matter on the agenda.

Rebecca Goddard of 2339A New Hope Road, Hendersonville spoke in favor of Cottontown preservation and against GNRC. She also spoke about greenways.

Commissioner Wynne called for a point of order and stated greenways are not on the agenda. Chairman Hyde overruled and allowed Ms. Goddard to continue.

Clark Wright of 205 County House Road, Cottontown asked the Commissioners to overturn the Mayor's veto to allow the Cottontown community to preserve the Draper House and post office.

Suzanne Edds of 305 Bugg Hollow, Gallatin spoke in favor of preserving the Cottontown community.

Susie Farrell of 1500 Upper Station Camp Creek Road, Cottontown spoke in favor of saving the Draper House. She also gave the history of the Draper House and old post office. She asked the Commissioners to show their support for Cottontown and override the veto.

Linda Kelly of 791 Upper Station Camp Road, Cottontown expressed her support to restore the Draper House and post office and asked the Commission to override the Mayor's veto.

Charlena Aumiller of 143 Ruland Circle, Hendersonville thanked the Commission for approving the budget amendment for the summer school/scholars program. She spoke against Resolution 2305-03. Ms. Aumiller asked to maintain the veto and spoke against county tax money used for private use.

Charlotte Gribbins of 2339 Hwy. 25, Cottontown spoke against development in Cottontown. Requested a plan be in place before giving the property to a non-profit.

Lisa Rich of 697 Bugg Hollow, Gallatin spoke in favor of saving the Draper House.

Pam Nolen of 199 Nolen Circle, Cottontown spoke in favor of saving the Draper House. Ms. Nolen stated she emailed her Commissioner and asked he reconsider his vote to pull the Draper House out of the FEMA grant program and stand with Cottontown. She read aloud his response to her email.

Tracy Finegan of 737 Shun Pike, Cottontown requested to override the veto. She read 196 names of people who have signed a petition to save the Draper House and old post office and also noted another 47 signed online.

With no one else wishing to speak on regular agenda items, recognition of the public was closed.

2305-03 A RESOLUTION FOR THE DIRECTOR OF SCHOOLS TO FOLLOW TCA AND THIS RESOLUTION

WHEREAS T.C.A. § **49-2-301.** states, Each local board of education is authorized to employ a director of schools, as provided for in § 49-2-203, subject to requirements of law. . . (b) (1) It is the duty of the board of education to assign to its director of schools the duty to:

(Q) Make a written report, quarterly, to the appropriate local legislative body, for the board, of all receipts and expenditures of the public school funds, which accounts shall contain full information concerning the conditions, progress and needs of the schools of the school system and which shall be audited by the appropriate fiscal officer and local legislative body;

(R) Be present at all quarterly and annual settlements of the county trustee with the county mayor covering all school funds arising from state apportionments, county levies and all other sources, and report the director's acts to the director of schools' board;

(S) Report to the local legislative body and the commissioner, whenever it appears to the director that any portion of the school fund has been, or is in danger of being, misappropriated or in any way illegally disposed of or not collected;

(U) Prepare, annually, a budget for the schools in the director's school system, submit the budget to the board for its approval and present it to the county or other appropriate local legislative body for adoption as provided for by charter or private legislative act; provided, that:

(i) The budget shall set forth in itemized form the amount necessary to operate the schools for the scholastic year beginning on July 1, following, or on such date as provided for by charter or private legislative act; and

(ii) Any change in the expenditure of money as provided for by the budget shall first be ratified by the local board and the appropriate local legislative body;

(V) Give the director's full time and attention to the duties of the director's position;

WHEREAS, T.C.A. § 49-2-203. Part 2 Duties and powers of Boards of Education states:

(a) (9) (A) (i) Require the director of schools and the chair of the local board of education to prepare a budget on forms furnished by the commissioner, and when the budget has been approved by the local board, to submit the budget to the appropriate local legislative body. The director of schools and the chair of the local board of education shall prepare a budget according to the revenue estimates and revenue determinations made by the county legislative body under \S 49-2-101(1)(D)

(ii) No LEA shall submit a budget to the local legislative body that directly or indirectly supplants or proposes to use state funds to supplant any local current operation funds, excluding capital outlay and debt service;

WHEREAS, the Chair of the Education Committee has previously requested the Director of Schools be present to answer questions concerning the finances/budget of Sumner County Schools at the Education Committee and County Commission meetings.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Sumner County Board of County Commissioners meeting in regular session this the 15th day of May 2023, do hereby request the Director of Schools be present at all meetings in the future to

> discuss budgetary matters and have the quarterly financial report prepared for the Education Committee and the county legislative body.
