Jim Latimer of 1578 Latimer Lane, Hendersonville, spoke about the Latimer family history and asked for the Brown House to be preserved.

Tommy Latimer of 264 Hester Road, Portland spoke about the history of the Brown House and expressed his support for preserving the house.

Diane Stinson of 1011 Lynndale Drive, Castalian Springs, asked the County to honor Mr. Brown's wishes and preserve the Brown House.

Cindy McClard of 102 Tioga Trail, Hendersonville spoke in favor of using the \$500,000.00 to preserve the Brown House and for it to be the centerpiece of the park, as stated in Mr. Brown's will.

Mike McClard of 102 Tioga Trail, Hendersonville spoke in favor of preserving the Brown House with the \$500,000.00 as Mr. Brown intended.

Kevin Baigert of 424 AB Wade Road, Portland expressed his concerns about the letter from the Comptroller's Office about the general-purpose school budget. He applauded the efforts to preserve the Brown House. Also expressed his concerns about Resolution 2410-18 and VFD and asked why there is no comprehensive plan to help save money. He also spoke to the carryover of \$9,400,000.00 from the approximate \$15,700,000.00 that was an emergency to allocate a year ago.

Rod Harkleroad, CEO of Highpoint Health with Ascension St. Thomas, 55 Hartsville Pike, Gallatin spoke to the opioid grant and asked for support to help make a difference in the community. He stated 51% of the mortality rates from overdoses come to Sumner Regional Medical Center.

Charlena Aumiller of 143 Ruland Circle, Hendersonville spoke to the Brown House, the trust and the park grant.

Laura Baigert of 424 AB Wade Road, Portland thanked the Commissioners for not adding the roundabout to the agenda. She spoke in support of honoring Mr. Brown's wishes and asked the Commission to reconsider the Westmoreland EMS station and ask for more information.

Elizabeth Michael of 1745A Garrison Branch Road, Cottontown, spoke to the Brown House and stated there will be a lawsuit filed to return the money if the County does not comply with the will of Mr. Brown.

Rebecca Goddard of 2339A New Hope Road, Hendersonville asked for the County to adhere to Mr. Brown's will.

WHEREAS, the Sumner County Regional Planning Commission forwarded a negative recommendation that the property be rezoned to Commercial Neighborhood (CN) by a unanimous vote; and

WHEREAS, due notice was published and a hearing held in accordance with Tennessee Code Annotated 13-7-105 and Chapter 14, Section 1414 of the Sumner County Zoning Resolution; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Sumner County Board of County Commissioners meeting in regular session on this the 21st day of October, 2024 that this body hereby approves the request to rezone the subject property from Rural Preservation (RP) to Commercial Neighborhood (CN);

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this rezoning shall take effect immediately upon adoption, the public welfare requiring it.

During discussion, Commissioner Becker moved, seconded by Commissioner Jones, to suspend the rules to allow Planning and Engineering Director Josh Suddath to speak about the matter. Mr. Suddath explained the retail market use on the property is protected, "grandfathered in", under state statue as long as there is not a lapse of operation for more than thirty months. The flea market that was operating is not a grandfathered use and has been discontinued.
