MINUTES SUMNER COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS JANUARY 27, 2025

The Board of County Commissioners of Sumner County, Tennessee met in regular session on January 27, 2025, in the Commission Chambers of the Sumner County Administration Building in Gallatin, Tennessee at 7:00 p.m. Present and presiding was the Chairman Merrol N. Hyde. Also present were the County Clerk Carolyn Templeton, and Staff Attorney Steve Weiner, and the following Commissioners to wit:

Having a duly constituted quorum, the meeting was opened in due process by Sheriff Eric Craddock.
