The Board of County Commissioners of Sumner County, Tennessee met in regular session on April 20, 2026, in the Commission Chambers of the Sumner County Administration Building in Gallatin, Tennessee at 7:00 p.m. Present and presiding was the Chairman Jerry Becker. 2604-05 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A TWELVE DOLLAR AND FIFTY CENT (\$12.50) CHARGE TO CRIMINAL DEFENDANTS FOR STATE MISDEMEANORS AND FELONIES FOR THE PURPOSES SET OUT IN T.C.A. 40-3-106

WHEREAS, T.C.A. 40-3-106 authorizes the clerk of every court having jurisdiction of state misdemeanors and felonies to include in every misdemeanor and felony cost bill a charge of twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) that must be remitted to the county government for the purpose of providing supplemental funding for the office of the district attorney general within that judicial district. Any unencumbered moneys and any unexpended balance of such funds remaining at the end of the fiscal year do not revert to the state general fund but must be carried forward for the purpose for which they were originally intended; and

WHEREAS, under T.C.A. 40-3-106 the aforesaid clerks may only charge the twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) upon adoption of a resolution by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the county legislative body of such county; and

WHEREAS, the county legislative body of Sumner County, Tennessee finds that implementation and collection of the foregoing charge will promote public safety and is in the best interests of the county.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Sumner County Board of County Commissioners meeting in regular session on this the 20th day of April, 2026 that:

SECTION 1. The clerk of every court in Sumner County having jurisdiction of state misdemeanors and felonies shall include in every misdemeanor and felony cost bill a charge of twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) that must be remitted to the county government for the purpose of providing supplemental funding for the office of the district attorney general in this judicial district. This section does not apply to nonmoving traffic violations. Any unencumbered moneys and any unexpended balance of such funds remaining at the end of a fiscal year do not revert to the state general fund but must be carried forward for the purpose for which they were originally intended; and

SECTION 2. All costs collected by Sumner County pursuant to this Resolution must be used for providing support services for the purpose of promoting public safety at the sole discretion of the district attorney general for the 18th Judicial District; and

SECTION 3. Sumner County may supplement the funds of the district attorney general system to promote public safety. The costs collected by Sumner County under this Resolution are supplemental and in addition to any funds received under this chapter or under Title 8, Chapter 7, relative to district attorneys general; and

SECTION 4. In every misdemeanor and felony prosecution in which restitution is ordered or the privilege tax for criminal injuries compensation fund established by T.C.A. 40-24-107 is also levied, the cost imposed by this Resolution does not have priority over collection of that restitution or privilege tax; and

SECTION 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage by 2/3 vote of the Sumner County Commission and approval by the Sumner County Mayor, the public welfare requiring it.
